Note:

The Australian Railways Union was formed in Melbourne in September 1920 with the amalgamation of the Queensland Railways Union, the New South Wales Amalgamated Railway and Tramway Service Association, the Victorian Railway Union, the Railway and Tramway Employees Association of South Australia and the Tasmanian Railway Union. It was the first Australian All-Grades organization of Railwaymen. $^{\!\! 1}$ The same Unions had attempted to form a Federal body at a Brisbane Conference in May 1918 but were denied federal registration until after 1920 when a High Court decision for the Amalgamated Society of Engineers made it possible for semi-State Instrumentality Unions to obtain Federal registration and jurisdiction in industrial disputes. The first General Meeting of the ARU was held in Melbourne. 8 October 1920. On 8 February 1921 Federal registration was granted.2

Until the 1970s the ARU was a federation of loosely linked Branches identified according to State boundaries. The Federal governing body was the national convention - the Australian Council, but policies of State Branches were decided at separate conferences and the Federal Office acted mainly in an advisory role to the States who conducted their own arbitration work.3

In 1976 new rules were registered which adopted significant structural changes agreed upon at the 1973 Convention.4 The major change was to replace the State Conferences and Australian Council by one biennial National Conference to determine policy. In the same year the West Australian Amalgamated Society of Railway Employees became the West Australian Branch of the ARU giving the organization complete national coverage. The National Office has been in Sydney since October 1944.

Note: (contd)

The ARU is an industry union covering all grades of employees working on or in connection with the railway or tramway industry. It does not cover locomotive enginemen - except in Queensland - and does not encourage

craftsmen in the trade areas.5
