### ADMINISTRATIVE HISTORY

In June 1886 a meeting of shearers was held at Fern's Hotel, Ballarat to form the **Australasian Shearers' Union**. W G Spence was elected President and D Temple, Secretary. During the same year unions of shearers were also being formed at Wagga Wagga, Bourke, Moree and other localities, including South Australia.

In January 1887 the Australasian Shearers' Union amalgamated with the Bourke and Wagga Wagga unions to form the Amalgamated Shearers' Union of Australasia (ASU). The three component unions became Branches of the ASU. The former Australasian Shearers' Union became known as the Creswick Branch and it was agreed that the Executive of the Creswick Branch become the Executive of the Union. At a general meeting of the ASU held at Ballarat, the following officers were elected: AG Spence, President, D Temple, Secretary and D Fern, Treasurer. By the time of the Ballarat meeting a new Branch had been formed at Cobar.

At the Annual Conference of the ASU held at Wagga Wagga in February 1888, agreement on amalgamation was reached with representatives of the South Australian Shearers Union, which upon amalgamation became the Adelaide Branch of the ASU. In March 1888 a further Branch of the ASU was formed at Young. The Moree Shearers' Union, which had been formed by JJ Grayndler and H Attenborough in 1886, with JJ McCarthy elected as its first Secretary, became a Branch of the ASU in May 1888.

At the February 1889 conference of the ASU it was decided to open a second Branch in South Australia at Port Augusta and, in Victoria, a second Branch was founded at Casterton. A further Branch was established at Scone during the Feb 1890 conference and in 1891 a Branch was opened at Goulburn.

In 1890 ASU machinery was used to recruit shed hands and bush labourers into a new union which was formally established as the **General Labourers' Union of Australasia** (GLU) at its inaugural conference in February 1891. The conference was presided over by W G Spence and D Temple, with Spence being elected as first secretary of the GLU and J Slattery elected as President. The government and management provisions of the ASU's constitution were adopted and ASU Branch boundaries were applied to the GLU.

In February 1894 the GLU and ASU amalgamated to form the **Australian Workers' Union (AWU).** During the same year the Executive Council of the AWU closed the Port Augusta Branch. At the 1895 Annual Conference it was decided to establish a Sydney Branch and the Head Office was moved from Creswick to Sydney.

The 1890s saw many AWU Branch closures. The Casterton Branch collapsed and closed in 1896. At the 1897 conference, Moree, Goulburn, Young and Sydney Branches were also closed. The four remaining NSW Branches were renamed Eastern (Scone), Western (Bourke), Central (Coonamble) and Southern (Wagga Wagga). The headquarters of the Central Branch was moved from Coonamble to Orange. The Eastern and Southern Branches were closed at the 1898 and 1899 conferences respectively.

In 1901 the Creswick Branch was renamed the Victoria-Riverina Branch and the office was moved from Creswick to St Arnaud. In 1904 the office was again moved to Ballarat. Branches were established in Tasmania and Western Australia in 1908, with L E Evans and T L Brown being the first Secretaries of the respective Branches.

In Queensland, the Queensland Shearers' Union was formed in January 1887 and registered in August 1888 under the Queensland Trade Union Act. By 1889 it was Queensland's biggest union. In April 1892 it amalgamated with the Queensland Labourers' Union (established in 1888 at Saltern Creek as the Central Queensland Labourers' Union, with Headquarters at Barcaldine) to form the Amalgamated Workers' Union of Queensland.

The three Branches of the Amalgamated Workers' Union of Queensland, at Longreach, Hughenden and Charleville, amalgamated with the Australian Workers' Union in 1904 and became the Queensland Branches of the Union. These three Branches were the "bush unions" of Queensland and their activities did not extend to the coastal districts. In 1908, the Hughenden Branch closed down, leaving two Queensland Branches. Thus by 1909 the AWU had eight Branches throughout Australia and a total membership of 44 000.

The Amalgamated Workers' Association of Queensland (AWAQ) was founded by E G Theodore in 1910. It is possible that the Amalgamated Workers' Association of North Queensland, which existed in 1908, was a predecessor. Amalgamation between the AWAQ and the AWU was considered at a large amalgamation conference held in Sydney in June 1912.

Arising out of the conference, amalgamations were cemented in 1913 with the Australian Carriers' Union, the Amalgamated Rabbit Trappers' Union and the Rural Workers' Union (Victoria), as well as the AWAQ. It is possible that the Associated Workers' Union of Townsville was also seeking to amalgamate at this time.

Following the amalgamation with the AWAQ, the Longreach and Charleville Branches of the AWU became Districts of the newly established Queensland Branch of the AWU: the Western and South Western Districts respectively. The old Branches of the Amalgamated Workers' Association of Queensland formed further Districts of the Queensland Branch of the AWU: the Far Northern (with its headquarters at Chillagoe), the Northern (with its headquarters at Townsville), and the Southern. The Southern District's headquarters was moved to Cairns and the Southern District was split into two: the Central District with its headquarters at Bundaberg, and the Southern District with its headquarters at Brisbane.

Branches of the AWU were organised in Western Australia and Tasmania in 1908. In 1915 the **General Workers' Union of West Australia**, whose members were engaged in railway, road and general construction work amalgamated with the AWU. In 1917 the **Federated Mining Employees' Association** (FMEA) (with the exception of Broken Hill) became part of the Union. In the same year a separate Branch was established at Darwin with Harold Nelson as Secretary. The Branch failed, possibly in the 1950s. A further attempt was again made to open an office in Darwin in 1978 under the administration of the Head Office. This attempt was unsuccessful, however, and the office finally closed in 1980.

In 1916 a decision was made to establish Industrial Branches of the Union and in July the Railway Workers and General Labourers' Association of NSW amalgamated with the AWU, forming the Railway Workers Industry Branch of the Union with George Bodkin as Secretary. Also under discussion were similar amalgamation proposals with the Federated Mining Employees' Association (FMEA) of Tasmania, but in the event, the FMEA became part of the Tasmanian Branch. The first Mining Industry Group was not established until 1919, with George McKennay as Secretary and headquarters at Boulder, Western Australia. Later, in February 1933, the Central Branch and the Railway Workers Industry Branch merged to form the NSW Branch.

In mid 1941 the Union amalgamated with the United Labourers' Union of NSW.

In 1976 the Wool & Basil Workers' Federation of Australia amalgamated with the AWU, as did the Undertakers Assistants & Cemetery Employees' Union of Australia in 1988. A further amalgamation with the Federation of Industrial, Manufacturing & Engineering Employees in 1993 led to the formation of the AWU-FIME Amalgamated Union.


In 1995 the AWU-FIME Amalgamated Union became known as the Australian Workers' Union (AWU).



Note:

The Queensland Shearers' Union was organised in 1886 by men at Isis Downs and a conference called for January 1887 at Blackall, with Christy Last organising secretary. Although nothing was achieved at the conference, the union was formed with A.K. Pennycuick as secretary for time being. He was later succeeded by W. Kewley. The Q.S.U. was registered as a trade union on 3 August 1888, with headquarters at Blackall

The Queensland Laborers' Union was formed in 1888 at Saltern Creek, with headquarters at Barcaldine. T.E. McGregor was appointed the first secretary and was succeeded by H.O. Blackwell, R.L. Crone and T.J. Ryan. Other branches were formed in 1891 at Roma (Maranoa Branch) - E.H. Murphy, Secretary) and Comet Branch at Springsure (W.C. Curtis, Secretary).

During this period negotiations had been in progress for amalgamation of all the Bush Unions, resulting in both bodies in Queensland agreeing at their annual meetings in December 1891 to become one organisation under the title of The Amalgamated Workers' Union of Queensland. The country was worked from three centres under branches which kept in touch with each, and whose annual meetings decided upon a uniform policy. Their respective headquarters were at Longreach (W. Kewley, secretary), Hughenden (W. C. Curtis, secretary) and Charleville (E. T. Brennan, secretary).

Meanwhile the unions in the southern colonies had formed together under the name of the Australian Workers' Union in 1894, and the Queensland section of the Bush Unions joined the A.W.U. in 1904 and became branches of that organisation.
