Note: The Seamen's Union was founded in 1872, the first branch possibly being Port Adelaide. It was known as The Federated Seamen's Union of Australasia from 1874, although the N.Z. branches may not have been organized till 1880. (The N.Z. connection lasted till about 1922). After the Maritime strikes of the 1890's, when branches suffered loss of membership and in some cases disbandment, a period of consolidation followed until 1919 when, after a relatively successful strike, the union entered a more radical period under leaders Thomas Walsh and Jacob Johnson. Struggles over "job control" led to the deregistration of the union in 1925, which was not reversed till 1930. The 1935 strike against the Dethridge Award received little support from the rest of the waterfront, and in 1938 a rival union, the Australian Seamen's Federation, was registered. The years from 1938-41 were concerned mainly with struggles to win back membership to the SUA, and the "scab" union (ASF) was finally deregistered in that year).

The thirties were notable for some confusion in the role of General Secretary. Joseph Keenan took over from Johnson in the 1935 strike, and Chris Herbert from the Sydney branch for some time acted as General Secretary, but at the same time Johnson continued to operate as "General Secretary" and had some support from factions in Melbourne and Brisbane. The position was regularised in 1937 when W.J. Daley was elected, and E.V. Elliott (Qld Branch secretary) succeeded him as General Secretary in late 1940, and currently holds the same position.

Since that date the union has been involved in support for Indonesia 1945-49, Malaya 1948, boycotts against Greek shipping (1948) and arms to Korea and Indo-China in the 1950's, and a score of social and political issues.

\* This deposit of records represents almost a total collection of the surviving records of the Federal Office and Sydney branch. A set of Federal Executive minutes are still housed in the Federal Office premises in Sydney. A fire in the premises in 1956 possibly destroyed some material. The branch material in this collection was forwarded to the Federal Office for the celebration of the Centenary (September 1972), and thence to the Australian National University. Other branch material (South Australia) can be found in deposits P92 and E198.
